Termination of Support Order

Termination of a support order is the ending of a current support obligation. Any unpaid child support obligation still needs to be paid.

A Child Support obligation may end when:

- The child has graduated from high school and has turned 18.
- The legal custody of the child has changed
- Child Support cannot continue past the age of 19 except in limited circumstances.

Establishment of Paternity

Paternity establishment is the legal determination of fatherhood.

Legal paternity in Ohio can be established by:

- Acknowledgment of paternity affidavit (legal document waiving genetic testing)
- Administrative Order through genetic testing (Child Support agency)
- Judicial Order (Court order)

Modification/Review of Support Order

If you have an existing child support order, you may qualify for a modification/review of your order.

Examples of reasons for a review but not limited to are:

- Three years since your last review
- Incarceration
- If there is a 30% change in income for at least six months or more
- Permanently disabled or receiving Social • Security
